



PBS LearningMedia is an awesome way for teachers to find public media materials. You can select from over 35,000 digital resources by Grade Level, Subject, Standards (including CCSS), and Collections. There are weekly themes posted at the top of the page, and below that you'll find ways to browse the collection. After looking at 3 lessons, you'll be prompted to make a free account. While I was preparing this newsletter, the weekly theme just happened to match a science department's LDC work! I haven't had much luck searching by common core standards, so I recommend searching by subject and/or grade.



Then, you can narrow by a variety of fields. If you want a full fledged lesson plan, narrow the resource type. You can also simply search for multi-media items on a topic. Some materials are even available in other languages—just select the language from the menu.
